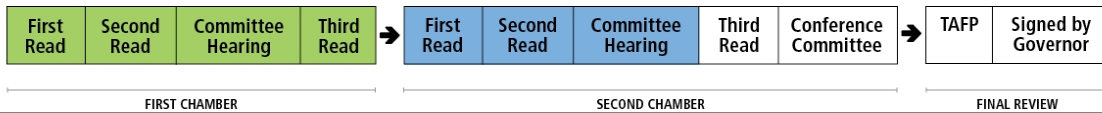

Degree offerings: Allows community colleges and the West Plains campus of Missouri State University to offer baccalaureate degrees in limited circumstances, recognized the University of Missouri as the state's only public research university and exclusive grantor of research doctorates, details when the Coordinating Board for Higher Education may authorize a degree program outside an institution's approved mission, allows each state college to offer graduate and doctoral degrees in limited circumstances, and allows State Technical College of Missouri to offer associate of arts or baccalaureate degrees in limited circumstances. **Language added to SB 355.**

Amended to include: Changes the employer contribution for the College and University Retirement Plan and requires employees to contribute to the plan.

In addition, no medical school in the state shall prohibit, discourage, or otherwise restrict a medical student organization or medical organization from conducting a study on the prevalence of depression, suicide, or other mental health issues among medical students. 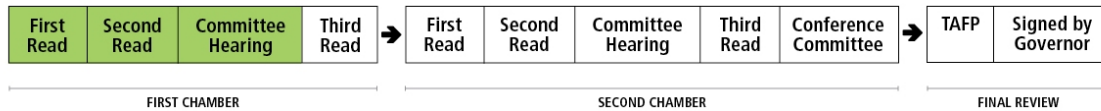

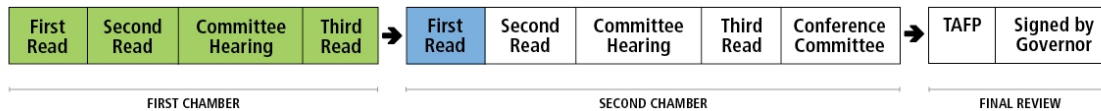

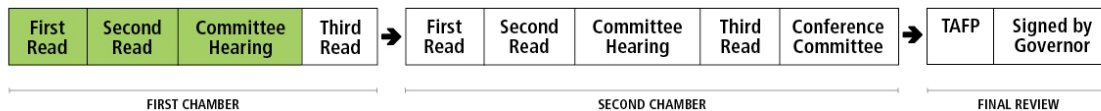

HB 1216 **Curtman** Joint Committee on Education: Requires the Joint Committee on Education to undertake additional duties related to oversight of the state education system, including reviewing and evaluating all grant applications for grant-funded activities implemented in institutions of higher education and maintaining an independent or commercial institutional review board to review, before collection or receipt of data, research proposals that would involve the use of data held by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

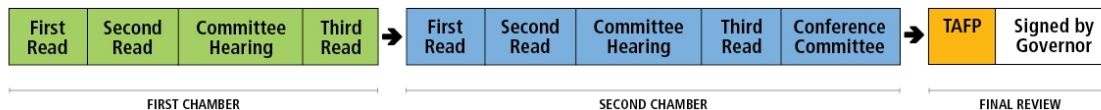

Amended to include: Changes to the county employees' retirement fund, to the St. Louis police officers' retirement requirements, to the vesting period for MOSERS Year 2000 Plan, to the pension forfeiture for members of a public retirement plan who commit a felony, to the beneficiary requirements in PSRS/PEERS, to the teaching allowances for retired teachers from the KCPSRS, to the public school retirement system of the City of St. Louis, and allows for a retirement buyout of terminated vested MOSERS members.
