5. Describe the need for this new major including evidence of student demand for the program and market or societal need for the skills being developed.

The Department of Theatre has historically served three different types of students: 1) students who want to teach Theatre in the public schools, 2)) students who want to pursue a Theatre performance degree and/or go on to graduate school in a Theatre performance-related field, and 3) students who want to pursue a Theatre Technical degree and/or go on to graduate school in a Theatre Technical -related field. The current BM in Musical Theatre degree serves only students in group #1 and provides an overview of Musical Theatre, regardless of their chosen direction, to the other two groups. However, students in these groups differ vastly from each other in terms of ability and future goals. The demands of a performance career or future graduate studies in performance are much higher and require a much more comprehensive educational experience than what is currently offered in the general BM in Musical Theatre degree.

The Department of Theatre is beginning to seek accreditation with the National Association of Schools of Theatre (NAST). This proposal will allow us to better serve these 3 distinct types of students the Department of Theatre has traditionally taught. It will also allow the department to better target recruiting efforts to these separate types of theatre students and diversify our offerings to better compete with similarly sized institutions in the region and will help us attain NAST certification. Making us one of only six schools in the state with NAST accreditation.

- 7. Are there similar programs offered at other Missouri institutions? Yes If so, how is this program unique or different from existing programs?

Several Missouri Institutions offer a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Musical Theatre. This program would not necessarily compete head-to-head with the larger programs as total Theatre funding, number of full-time faculty, and larger student populations creates a vastly different learning environment than what MSSU can offer. While the degree is titled the same, and both meet the same NAST standards, students will have a choice of the type of environment in which they would like to study. Many Missouri smaller institutions offer programs in Musical Theatre which are tailored to a BA or BS. Changing our degree offerings here at MSSU, our theatre program will be able to compete with all state universities and colleges, and allow more flexibility in our offerings for our students.

8. Describe the curriculum requirements for the major.

NAST standards dictate that degrees in performance are considered professional degrees and require at least 65% of the content of the degree (based upon 120-hour bachelor's degree) to be in theatre-related coursework. This proposal includes a core theatre area of 67% theatre content with the remaining 33% in the General Education area.

The curriculum is designed to teach the entire performer with rigorous coursework in musical theatre theory, musical theatre history, individual performance, musical experience, and dance. These courses meet NAST standards for undergraduate performance degrees.

9. What are the student learning objectives for the program?

Students will be able to perform as soloists and ensemble members at appropriate levels for entry into graduate theatre study.

Students will be able to analyze and synthesize musical theatre in ways that helps improve performance standards.

Students will be able to recognize, classify, and interpret a common body of musical theatre literature and individual repertoire.

Students will gain a common knowledge of the styles of musical theatre.

Students will demonstrate that public performance is a means for engaging a community and contribute to general cultural awareness and arts culture.

10. How will the objectives be assessed?

Ensemble and individual performance standards will be assessed every semester in individual and ensemble performances. Performances at the senior level will be capstone experiences that focus on each student's individual performance skills.

The theatre movement courses will address analyzing and synthesizing physical theatre and dance styles, where students will perform advanced choreographies.

Students will be given an overview of the production elements involved with musical theatre so as to be able to work in any area yet keep their focus on performing.

The musical theatre history course sequence and literature courses will assess the common body of musical theatre literature and individual repertoire.

Ensemble and individual performances engage the community through public performance. Feedback to the performers is given after each performance.
