

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Missouri Southern State University Proposed Statewide Mission Change

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Background

- Missouri Southern State University (MSSU) submitted a proposal on July 14, 2023, for an enhancement to its statewide mission
- MSSU's current mission is in the areas of international/global education
- MSSU seeks to add Health and Life Sciences and Immersive Learning Experiences to the statewide mission



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- The CBHE shall review applications from institutions seeking a statewide mission
- Institutions shall provide evidence that they have the capacity to discharge successfully such a mission.
- No statewide mission shall become effective until the general assembly approves the proposed mission change by concurrent resolution

§ 173.030(8) and (9), RSMo



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Public Comments

- The proposal to expand MSSU's statewide mission was posted for public comment on July 20, 2023
- Two public comments were received



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- 1. The institution must show that it enrolls a representative cross-section of Missouri students. Evidence may include, but is not limited to:
 - Enrolling at least 40% of its Missouri resident, first-time degreeseeking freshmen from outside its historic statutory service region
 - Enrolling its Missouri undergraduate students from at least 80% of all Missouri counties
 - Enrolling one or more groups of special population students such as minorities, economically disadvantaged, or physically disadvantaged from outside its historic statutory service region at rates exceeding state averages of such populations enrolled in the higher educational institutions of this state



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2. The institution must also show that it offers one or more programs of **unusual strength** which respond to a **specific statewide need**. Examples of evidence the institution may present includes, but is not limited to:

- National, discipline-specific accreditation
- Independent certification for meeting national or state standards or requirements
 - **?** Placement rates significantly higher than average
- ? Licensure or registration rates for graduates seeking such recognition significantly higher than average
- Quality of program faculty responds to a specific statewide need



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- 3. The institution must show that it has a **clearly articulated** admission standard consistent with the provisions of:
 - § 173.005.2(6), RSMo: "The **Coordinating Board** for Higher Education shall establish **admission guidelines** consistent with institutional missions"

OR

• § 174.130, RSMo: "Each **board** may make such rules and regulations for the **admission** of students as may be deemed proper"



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4. The institution must show that it is characterized by a **focused** academic environment which identifies specific but limited areas of academic emphasis at the undergraduate, and if appropriate, at the graduate and professional school levels, including the identification of programs to be continued, reduced, terminated or targeted for excellence.

The institution shall, consistent with its focused academic environment, also have the demonstrable capacity to provide significant public service or research support that address statewide needs for constituencies beyond its historic statutory service region.



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5. The institution has adopted and maintains a **program of continuous quality improvement** and reports annually appropriate and verifiable **measures of institutional accountability** related to such program.

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Consumer Information Rule Revision

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Consumer Information

- Section 173.1004, RSMo
- Faculty names, credentials, and instructor ratings
- Course schedules that include the instructor and, if applicable, those instructors who are teaching assistants



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Rules for Posting Consumer Information

 Revisions made to definitions of credentials and faculty, updates the statutory reference to the definition of approved public institutions, and clarifies when course information must be posted

 Staff recommends approval of the proposed Consumer Information Rule Revisions and direct staff to begin the rulemaking process

 - 70% engagement 2023-2024
 - 90% engagement 2024-2025
 - 100% engagement 2025-2026

- 52 out of 57 CTEs engaged
- 91% engagement to date
- MOACTE Conference
- Apprenticeship Boot Camp

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Purpose

 The MoExcels initiative facilitates development and expansion of employer-driven education and training programs to substantially increase educational attainment and career opportunities for populations historically underserved by higher education



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Background

- May 4, 2023: RFP issued
- July 3, 2023: Applications were due
- MDHEWD received 22 new proposals
- Total requested: \$49,401,005
 - Late submission from OTC \$10M
 - Review/Ranking will occur later

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FY 2024 Supplemental Request

Missouri Student Loan Program

 \$5 million transfer authority from Federal Fund to Operating Fund

Lincoln University

 \$2,227,669 for needed increase in state match for federal Land Grant funding

Debt Offset

\$100,000 for Missouri State University

\$25,000 for Southeast Missouri State University



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DHEWD Operations

- Core Administration
 - Continue current staffing (48.63 FTE)
 - One-time fund reduction (\$106,537)

Office of Operations

- \$1,763,140 (GR)/No FTE
- Transition from current cost allocation for federal grant programs to an indirect cost rate
- Recommended by Department of Labor
- One-time funds needed for transition



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DHEWD Initiatives

- **Proprietary School Certification**
 - No FTE Change (5.0)
 - \$67,000 NDI (Spending Authority) to allow usage of increased fees previously CBHE approved
- MoExcels NDI
 - \$49,401,005
 - 22 requests for new projects
 - Detail in Tab 13



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Student Financial Assistance

- Requesting 3 core reductions to better match appropriation with projected spending levels:
 - Bright Flight
 - Core amount \$27,576,666
 - New proposed core \$23,000,000
 - Fast Track
 - Core amount \$4,700,000
 - New proposed core \$3,000,000
 - Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment
 - Core amount \$7,000,000
 - New proposed core \$2,000,000



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
- Office of Workforce Development (343.92 FTE)
 - Core request Administration (\$26,289,990)
 - Reflects removal of \$15,257 one-time funds
 - Includes \$2.5M for the P20W system
 - Core request Program Distribution (\$55,002,594)
 - Reflects a core reduction to match spending authority with actual federal dollars received
 - Almost entirely federal funding
 - Manage multiple workforce and related grants
 - Operate 24 job centers statewide
 - Multiple legislative earmarks



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- Office of Workforce Development (cont.)
 - Apprenticeship Missouri NDI
 - \$3,000,000 (2.25 FTE)
 - Fund switch from Job Training Fund to GR
 - Provide stable funding for continued expansion
 - Workforce Outreach NDI
 - \$1,000,000 (No FTE)
 - Funding for marketing and advertising prohibited by WIOA federal regulations.
