#1 Proprietary Certification

- The department is required to certify proprietary schools operating in Missouri
- The department proposes exempting USDOL approved Registered Apprenticeships training programs from certification



#2 Statute Revisions

- Revises statute to reflect recent changes:
 - Moving the Office of Workforce Development to DHEWD and moving statutes regarding the Office of Workforce Development to Chapter 173
 - Removing statutes that have sunset, programs that are no longer operable or funded, and task forces that no longer exist



#3 Bright Flight

- The "Higher Education Academic Scholarship Program" or "Bright Flight" is a merit-based financial aid program based on performance on the ACT or SAT

Background


- Two big goals: to be best compared to Midwestern peer states in educational attainment and labor force participation.

- The latest data is from 2021.



Population Aged 25-64, Associate Degree and Above, 2021







Big Goal: Labor Force Participation


 Labor force participation did not substantially change from 2021 to 2022.

Population Aged 16+, 2022









NUMBER OF DEGREES ISSUED BY MISSOURI INSTITUTIONS





NUMBER OF APPRENTICESHIPS AND CERTIFICATES ISSUED



EMPLOYMENT-POPULATION RATIO MISSOURI AND U.S.





OFFICIAL UNEMPLOYMENT RATE MISSOURI AND U.S.





Background

- Section 173.030, RSMo
- Review of institutional mission statements every five years
- Review based on needs of citizens, business, and the state
- Outcome is a mission implementation plan (CBHE-approved mission description)



Current Status

- Staff worked with institutions starting in 2022 to design mission statement review process
- Institutions received data collection forms in early 2023 for return by summer 2023, and the responses are found in Attachment B
- Staff reviewed proposed changes to mission descriptions, which are used in part to determine appropriate program review categories

CORDINATION

Mission Descriptions

- "...each institution shall prepare, in a manner prescribed by the coordinating board, a mission implementation plan for the coordinating board's consideration and approval"
- The mission descriptions are considered the implementation plans and are provided in Attachment A



Highlights and General Findings

- Institutions involved local and regional employers to assist in the development and updating of programs to meet existing and future needs
- All institutions continue to hold formal accreditation and pursue programmatic accreditation when available
- Admissions selectivity criteria may need to be revised





Background

- Progress goal shared with 80 stakeholders during an in-person Adult Learner Strategic Planning session in April
- Over the summer, ESG conducted interviews with individuals across the state
- Three focus areas emerged:
 - 1. Improve postsecondary access
 - 2. Improve postsecondary completion
 - 3. Improve workforce alignment



Current Status

- 23 tactics across the 3 focus areas were shared with over 60 stakeholders during an in-person Adult Learner Strategic Planning session in November
- Several tactics were chosen for further development and implementation in 2024







Missouri Resident FAFSAs





Demographic Change by Race/Ethnicity Public Institutions





Demographic Change by Age Cohort Public Institutions





First-Time Students, Public Institutions





Conclusions

- Enrollment increased by a modest amount across all sectors.
- First-time, degree-seeking, undergraduate FTE increased for the public 4-year sector but decreased for the public 2-year sector.
- FAFSA filing decreased, continuing a downward trend.
