## **BACKGROUND**

The Second Regular Session of the 99<sup>th</sup> General Assembly concluded on May 18, 2018.

## **CURRENT STATUS**

The following bills were truly agreed to and finally passed by the General Assembly and are awaiting signature by the Governor:

### **HB 1465 (Rep. Steve Cookson, R-Poplar Bluff)**

The bill modifies various provisions relating to degree offerings at public institutions of higher education and specifically outlines the CBHE's authority to approve, disapprove, or provisionally approve new degree programs. The bill allows public community colleges and technical colleges to offer baccalaureate degrees for certain fields; establishes the University of Missouri as the state's only public research university and exclusive grantor of research doctorates, doctor of philosophy degrees, and first-professional degrees in areas such as dentistry, law, medicine, optometry, pharmacy, and veterinary medicine; and prohibits any state college or university from seeking the land grant designation held by Lincoln University and the University of Missouri. Degrees in chiropractic, osteopathic medicine, podiatry, and engineering should be offered in collaboration with the University of Missouri, unless it declines to collaborate, in which case the institution can seek approval from the CBHE to offer the program independently. The bill was a legislative proposal by the department.

### **SB 807 & 577 (Sen. Jay Wasson, R-Springfield)**

The bill as originally introduced was identical to HB 1465. The bill became an omnibus higher education bill when the House Higher Education Committee added various provisions. The Senate refused to concur in a few of the provisions, so a conference committee was called and the following provisions prevailed:

- Public institutions of higher education are exempted from having to follow the laws pertaining to state purchases.
- A student's attendance does not have to occur in the three years *immediately* prior to graduation in order to be eligible for the A+ Schools Program.
- Community colleges are allowed to initiate the attachment to a local school district, provided that a majority of its board of trustees approves the plan and the community college district pays for the election. The plan will be introduced to voters of the school district and must be approved by a majority vote.
- Students attending virtual institutions can be eligible to receive funds from the Access Missouri Financial Assistance Program. The virtual institution must meet the following criteria: (1) be recognized as a qualifying institution by gubernatorial executive order, unless such order is rescinded; (2) be recognized as a qualifying institution through a memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and the approved virtual institution; (3) be accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education; (4) establish and continuously maintain a physical campus or location of operation within the state of Missouri; (5) maintain at least 25 full-time Missouri employees, at least one-half of which shall be faculty or administrators engaged in operations; (6) enroll at least 1,000 Missouri residents as degree or certificate seeking students; (7) organize as a nonprofit institution; and (8) utilize an exclusively competency-based education model. Currently, the only institution meeting these criteria is Western Governors University.

- Public institutions of higher education must publish a report relating to mental health services provided on campus.
- Higher education institutions that grant college level-credit, but are not accredited by a federally recognized regional accreditor, must disclose such fact to students during the admission process. This is known as the College Credit Disclosure Act and exempts institutions affiliated with a religious organization if such institution is accredited by a federally recognized faith-related accreditor.
- Students attending public institutions of higher education must score at least 70% on the Missouri Higher Education Civics Achievement Examination in order to graduate. The exam must consist of 50-100 questions similar to the United States citizenship exam.
- Public institutions of higher education may increase tuition by inflation plus an amount (no more than 5%) that would produce an increase in net tuition revenue no greater than the amount by which state operating support was reduced in the previous fiscal year.
- The list of professions of those whose children and spouses are eligible to receive a public safety officer or employee survivor grant from the CBHE is expanded to include air ambulance pilots, air ambulance registered professional nurses, air ambulance registered respiratory therapists, employees of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, and specified medical technicians.

#### **HB 1744 (Rep. Jim Hansen, R-Frankford)**

The bill as initially introduced modifies the A+ Schools Program by removing the requirement that a student's attendance occur in the three years *immediately* prior to graduation. The bill became a higher education omnibus bill when a Senate Substitute was adopted on the floor that adds the following provisions:

- Community colleges are allowed to initiate the attachment to a local school district, provided that a majority of its board of trustees approves the plan and the community college district pays for the election. The plan will be introduced to voters of the school district and must be approved by a majority vote.
- Public institutions of higher education are prohibited from requiring students to purchase meal plans or dine at on-campus facilities when a student has presented medical documentation of a food allergy or sensitivity, or a medical dietary issue.
- Students attending virtual institutions can be eligible to receive funds from the Access Missouri Financial Assistance Program. The virtual institution must meet the following criteria: (1) be recognized as a qualifying institution by gubernatorial executive order, unless such order is rescinded; (2) be recognized as a qualifying institution through a memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and the approved virtual institution; (3) be accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education; (4) establish and continuously maintain a physical campus or location of operation within the state of Missouri; (5) maintain at least 25 full-time Missouri employees, at least one-half of which shall be faculty or administrators engaged in operations; (6) enroll at least 1,000 Missouri residents as degree or certificate seeking students; (7) organize as a nonprofit institution; and (8) utilize an exclusively competency-based education model. Currently, the only institution meeting these criteria is Western Governors University.
- Missouri 529 account holders are allowed to retain tax exempt status when transferring funds from a 529 account to a Missouri ABLE account. This bill aligns state law with federal law.

**SB 990 (Sen. Dan Hegeman, R-Cosby)**

The bill allows community colleges to initiate attachment to a local school district, provided that a majority of its board of trustees approves such a plan and the community college district pays for the election. The plan will be introduced to voters of the school district and must be approved by a majority vote.

**SB 894 (Sen. Doug Libla, R-Poplar Bluff)**

The bill creates the “STEM Career Awareness Program” to increase awareness among students in grades six through eight. The bill also allows students to replace a math, science, or practical arts course with a computer science course provided that the student has taken all classes with a required end-of-course exam. The bill requires parents of students who take computer science in lieu of Algebra II to sign a waiver stating they understand the decision could have an adverse effect on college admission decisions. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education must cooperate with the CBHE to develop and implement computer science academic performance standards. The bill also modifies the “Missouri Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Initiative” by allowing Missouri taxpayers to have up to \$10,000 of their state tax liability transferred from the general revenue fund and placed in the STEM fund so long as the taxpayer provides educational benefits or selects a student majoring in a STEM field for an internship, or selects a student who recently graduated with a degree in a STEM field from any higher education institution for a full-time position in a STEM field located in the state of Missouri.

**SB 882 (Sen. Denny Hoskins, R-Warrensburg)**

The bill is similar to the provisions in HB 1744, but changes the Missouri Higher Education Savings Program to Missouri Education Savings Program to allow for 529 funds to be used at elementary and secondary education institutions.

**HB 1268 (Rep. Donna Lichtenegger, R-Jackson)**

The bill allows the Missouri Dental Board to issue a dental faculty permit to an individual who is employed by an accredited dental school, college, or program in Missouri. The holder of such permit is authorized to practice dentistry only within accredited dental school programs and only while engaged in teaching didactic courses, preclinical laboratories, and supervising student-delivered patient care.

**HB 2034 (Rep. Paul Curtman, R-Washington)**

The bill allows public institutions of higher education to engage in the study of the growth, cultivation, or marketing of industrial and agricultural hemp in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture so long as the proper registration and/or permit is obtained. Institutions of higher education are limited to areas of land up to twenty acres.

**HB 1606 (Rep. Elaine Gannon, R-De Soto)**

The bill requires the CBHE and the Department of Economic Development to provide specific career and salary information for each credential offered by a public institution of higher education. This information shall appear on the public institution’s website and in the course catalog alongside its credential offerings, if the institution currently publishes a course catalog.

*Please note: Additional bills may be presented at the board meeting that are not covered in this document as we continue to become aware of legislation that passed affecting higher education.*

## **NEXT STEPS**

For bills that were truly agreed to and finally passed, the governor has until July 14, 2018, to sign or veto bills. MDHE staff will continue to monitor legislation and as bills become law, will develop an implementation plan for those requiring action by the department and/or CBHE.

This bill would allow students attending certain virtual higher education institutions to receive Access Missouri awards.

Allows the Missouri Dental Board to issue dental faculty permits to individuals who are employed by accredited dental schools, colleges, or programs in Missouri

This bill allows the Missouri Dental Board to issue a dental faculty permit to individuals employed by an accredited dental school, college, or program in Missouri. The permit would allow individuals to practice dentistry without a Missouri license, but only in the course of teaching and supervising student care as part of an accredited dental school program.

HB 1270

Lant, Bill(R)



Allows any county to vote to exempt political subdivisions and public institutions of higher education engaged in the construction of public works wholly within the county from the prevailing wage law

**General Remarks :**

This bill allows residents of a county to vote to exempt public subdivisions and public institutions of higher education from the prevailing wage law for the construction of public works constructed wholly within the county.

**Bill History:**

HB 1272

Lant, Bill(R)



Allows public bodies to opt out of prevailing wage laws for the construction of public works projects that are \$750,000 or less

**Bill History:**

HB 1273

Kendrick, Kip(D)



Grants authority to the Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority to issue loans to refinance certain public or private student loans, education grants, and certain bonds, notes, or other obligations.

**General Remarks :**

Feb 3, 2018 - 17:31

This bill allows MOHELA to: (1) issue tax-exempt bonds and taxable revenue bonds, including bonds that are eligible for federal tax credits, exemptions, or payments; (2) issue loans to eligible borrowers to refinance certain public or private student loans; and (3) issue bonds, notes, or other obligations.

HB 1274

Kendrick, Kip(D)



Establishes the "Student Loan Bill of Rights"

**General Remarks :** Jan 11, 2018 - 09:47  
This bill would create a student loan ombudsman at the MDHE to help student loan borrowers and develop a student loan borrower education course. It would also require certain student loan servicers to be approved by the MDHE to operate in Missouri.

**Bill History:** 05-18-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Higher Education

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HB 1275 Kendrick, Kip(D)

Establishes a work-study program within the department of higher education



**General Remarks :** Feb 3, 2018 - 17:39  
This bill creates the "Allan Purdy Work-Study Program" for state residents enrolled as an undergraduate in a two-year or four-year institution of higher education. The program will be administered by the CBHE.

**Bill History:** 05-03-18 S Voted do pass from committee on Senate-Education

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HB 1358 Davis, Charlie(R)

Establishes the Password Privacy Protection Act.



**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:59  
This bill would prohibit public and private colleges and universities as well as vo-tech schools from requiring students to disclose login information for social media sites.

**Bill History:** 05-17-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Fiscal Review

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HB 1368 Basye, Chuck(R)

Changes the law regarding the Missouri Returning Heroes Education Act.



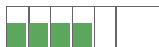
**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:29  
This bill would require public colleges and universities to charge no more than 30% of the cost of tuition and fees to combat veterans who are pursuing graduate degrees.

**Bill History:** 05-03-18 S Voted do pass as substitute from committee on Senate-Veterans and Military Affairs

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HB 1408 Spencer, Bryan(R)

Modifies provisions relating to virtual education



**Bill History:** 04-10-18 S Meeting set for 1:00 PM, SCR 1 - Senate-Education

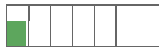
HB 1419 Haefner, Marsha(R)



Requires certain health care professionals to complete two hours of suicide prevention training as a condition of licensure.

**Bill History:** 05-14-18 S Voted do pass as substitute from committee on Senate-Professional Registration

HB 1434 Berry, T.J.(R)



Modifies provisions relating to marriage and replaces marriage licenses with contracts of domestic union

**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:23  
This bill changes statutory references from "marriage" to "contract of domestic union" in sections including 173.310, which prohibits the hiring of relatives of higher education board members.

**Bill History:** 05-18-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Children and Families

HB 1450 May, Karla(D)



Requires the state to match federal funding for land grant institutions in this state and prohibits the state from seeking a waiver or requiring an institution to seek a waiver of the match obligation.

**Bill History:** 04-10-18 H Public hearing completed

HB 1455 Lauer, Jeanie(R)



Requires high schools and public institutions of higher education to provide information related to careers and salaries to students.

**General Remarks :** Feb 5, 2018 - 13:15  
This bill would require the CBHE and DED to provide information for each credential offered by a public college or university, including common areas of employment for people who hold the degree, the number and type of jobs available, percent of graduates with the degree who are employed within a year of graduation, average salary for each of the first five years after graduation, length of time required to earn the credential, and the estimated cost of the credential.

HB 1457 Lauer, Jeanie(R)



Requires school districts to offer a course on computer programming to high school students.



**Bill History:** 05-17-18 H Dropped from Calendar - Pursuant to House Rules

HB 1458 Lauer, Jeanie(R)



Requires public institutions of higher education to make instructor evaluations available to enrolled students of such institutions.

**General Remarks :** Jan 11, 2018 - 09:53  
This bill would require public colleges and universities to make student evaluations of instructors available to enrolled students.

**Bill History:** 01-17-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Higher Education

HB 1465 Cookson, Steve(R)  
Wasson, Jay(R)



Modifies various provisions relating to degree offerings at public institutions of higher education.

**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:21  
This bill would allow the Coordinating Board for Higher Education to consider proposals from public colleges and universities seeking to offer academic programs outside of their historical mission in order to meet a demonstrated workforce need.

**Bill History:** 03-28-18 H Truly Agreed to and Finally Passed

HB 1474 Brattin, Rick(R)



Eliminates tenure for new employees at public institutions of higher education and specifies information that public institutions of higher education must make available to the public.

**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:36  
This bill would prohibit public colleges and universities from awarding tenure to any person hired after January 1, 2019. It would also require public colleges and universities to post information about each degree program offered on a publicly accessible website, including total cost, employment opportunities, and earnings.

**Bill History:** 02-28-18 H Public hearing completed

HB 1477 Brattin, Rick(R)



Requires each state department to report expenditures to the appropriations committee that oversees the department

**Bill History:** 01-17-18 H Public hearing completed

HB 1493 Wood, David(R)

Requires school districts to recognize certain graduate and undergraduate hours as equivalent to a master's degree on the salary schedule.



**Bill History:** 03-14-18 H Voted do pass as amended from committee on House-Elementary and Secondary Education

HB 1517

McCann Beatty, Gail(D)

Requires the attorney general and the commissioner of administration to submit to the general assembly a monthly report of all settlements and judgments paid from the state legal expense fund.



**General Remarks :** Feb 11, 2018 - 20:34  
This bill requires a report to be submitted to the general assembly detailing all settlements and judgments paid in the previous month from the state legal expense fund.

HB 1528

Dohrman, Dean(R)

Requires students at public and private institutions of higher education to pass an examination on the provisions and principals of American civics as a condition of graduation.



**General Remarks :** Feb 3, 2018 - 16:51  
This bill requires any student pursuing an associate's or bachelor's degree from a public or private institution of higher education (except those attending private trade schools) to pass an examination on the provisions/principles of American civics with a score of at least 70%.

HB 1532

Butler, Michael(D)

Modifies the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Fund.



**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:28  
Current state law creates a fund the MDHE can use to match institutions' investments in STEM programs. This bill would create a tax incentive for employers to hire interns in STEM fields of study.

**Bill History:** 05-18-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Higher Education

HB 1560

Morris, Lynn(R)

Prohibits discrimination against children who are not immunized.



**General Remarks :** Jan 11, 2018 - 10:41  
The bill prohibits discrimination against students

because they have not been immunized as required due to an exemption under existing law.

**Bill History:** 05-09-18 H Public hearing completed

HB 1576

Wiemann, John D.(R)

Modifies provisions relating to administrative proceedings.



**General Remarks :**

Feb 12, 2018 - 10:49

This bill prohibits any state agency from implementing or enforcing any standard, requirement, or threshold unless it is explicitly required or permitted by statute or a rule that has been promulgated in accordance with Chapter 536. It also requires a report to be submitted to the general assembly if a fiscal note for a proposed rule requires an expenditure of moneys or a reduction in income to be more than \$500,000.

HB 1580

Franks, Bruce(D)

Modifies provisions relating to charter schools.

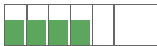

HB 1608

Kelly, Hannah(R)

Specifies that legislative research will compare the actual fiscal note of all bills Truly Agreed and Finally Passed by the General Assembly with the final fiscal note provided prior to passage.



**Bill History:** 03-28-18 S Voted do pass from committee on Senate-Government Reform

HB 1623

Fitzwater-49, Travis(R)

Establishes a statewide STEM career awareness program and enacts new provisions of law related to computer science.



**Bill History:** 03-27-18 S Voted do pass as substitute from committee on Senate-Economic Development

HB 1629

Evans, Jean(R)

Provides that a doctoral degree from programs accredited or provisionally accredited by the Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System are acceptable for licensure as a psychologist if the program meets certain requirements.



**General Remarks :**

Feb 6, 2018 - 11:22

This bill allows for a doctoral degree in psychology from a program accredited by the Psychological Clinical

Science Accreditation System to be acceptable to meet various requirements for psychologist licensure so long as the program meets certain requirements.

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HB 1644 Sommer, Chrissy(R)



Changes the laws regarding state agencies and departments by requiring the posting of information online that is published physically and making available the online submission of applications, forms, and payments.

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HB 1660 Swan, Kathy(R)



Modifies provisions relating to career and technical education.

**Bill History:** 05-01-18 S Voted do pass as substitute from committee on Senate-Education

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HB 1665 Swan, Kathy(R)  
Rowden, Caleb(R)



Establishes a visiting scholars certificate of license to teach.

**Bill History:** 03-14-18 S Truly Agreed to and Finally Passed

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HB 1677 Lauer, Jeanie(R)

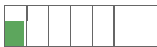


Allows students to take the ACT WorkKeys assessments instead of the ACT Plus Writing assessment.

**Bill History:** 02-26-18 H Set on the House Calendar

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HB 1678 Chipman, Jason(R)



Establishes the "Curriculum Transparency Act".

**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:33  
This bill would require public colleges and universities to post course syllabi, reading lists, attendance requirements, extra credit opportunities, and descriptions of required assignments and projects on a publicly accessible website.

**Bill History:** 01-09-18 H Committee hearing cancelled House-Higher Education

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HB 1679 Chipman, Jason(R)

Prohibits public institutions of higher education from requiring students to purchase a meal plan when a



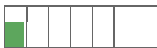
student presents medical documentation of a food allergy or sensitivity, or a medical dietary issue.

**General Remarks :** Feb 5, 2018 - 13:25  
This bill prevents any public institution of higher education from requiring a student to purchase meal plan(s) or to dine at on-campus facilities if the student has presented medical documentation of a food allergy or sensitivity, or a medical dietary issue, to the institution.

**Bill History:** 05-01-18 S Voted do pass from committee on Senate-Education

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HB 1680 Chipman, Jason(R)



Prohibits public institutions of higher education from requiring students to live on campus, except for first-year freshmen who may be required to live in campus housing for their first year.

**General Remarks :** Feb 6, 2018 - 19:44  
This bill prohibits public institutions of higher education from requiring students to live in campus housing, excluding first-time freshman who are in their first year of attendance, beginning July 1, 2019.

**Bill History:** 01-31-18 H Voted do not pass from committee House-Higher Education

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HB 1688 Eggleston, John(R)



Modifies provisions relating to institutional performance measures for institutions of higher education.

**General Remarks :** Jan 10, 2018 - 16:49  
This bill would replace the existing statutory language about "the sixth measure" in the performance funding model with "institutional performance measure relating to job placement in a field or position associated with the student's degree level and pursuit of a graduate degree." That measure would be weighted as 1/3 of the performance funding allocation, with the remaining measures weighted equally for the remaining 2/3.

The bill also provides that "unearned" money in the model would revert to general revenue rather than being distributed through the model.

Once the appointment has been made and the senate is notified, the governor is prohibited from withdrawing or rescinding the appointment, except in the case of charges of malfeasance, misfeasance, and nonfeasance in office.

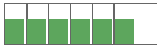

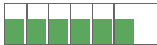

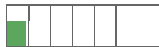
